

L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts introduces the world of jewelry to the general public through courses, conversations, and exhibitions.

Courses, which span the subjects of Savoir-Faire, Art History of Jewelry, and the Universe of Gemstones, are taught by a team of master jewelers and craftsmen, art historians, and gemologists.

In just a few hours, the participants manage to grasp the richness of this fascinating universe, from the mysteries of stones to the savoir-faire of jewelers, all while learning about the exciting history surrounding jewelry.

L'ÉCOLE's programming is further enhanced through conversations and exhibitions: Conversations bring together two experts who engage in a dialogue that explores the jewelry arts from a variety of perspectives. Exhibitions illustrate the many facets of the world of jewelry.

L'ÉCOLE, SCHOOL OF JEWELY ARTS IN NEW YORK CITY

L'ÉCOLE is located at Place Vendôme in Paris, however, its goal is to share its knowledge with the world. Every year, L'ÉCOLE travels to different destinations and offers a varying array of programming.

Following the success of its 2015 debut at Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum, L'ÉCOLE returns to New York City from October 25th to November 9th, 2018 and will be located at a new location, 2 East 63rd Street, in the Upper East Side.



15 COURSES

Each course can be taken à la carte, in any order, and is offered multiple times throughout L'ÉCOLE's two-and-a-half-weeks in New York City. Leading scholars in the fields of science, art, and history guide every class, with faculty that includes jewelers, designers, mockup artists, art and jewelry historians, gemologists, and lacquer artists. The classes are between 2-4 hours, led by 2-4 teachers with a maximum of 12 students. Class size is limited to ensure an intimate experience, and student interaction is fueled both by a shared passion for the jewelry arts and the chance to mingle during receptions prior to each class. These classes range in price from \$125-\$250.

L'ÉCOLE introduces the world of jewelry through three themes:

- •Savoir-Faire allows each student, even novices, to don a jeweler's coat and personally handle and manipulate materials and tools.
- Art History of Jewelry explores the practical and aesthetic evolutions of jewelry from ancient times through today.
- Universe of Gemstones illuminates the mysteries of how gems are created and valued through observation and experimentation.

EXHIBITIONS



Exhibitions are open 10:00 am-6:00 pm daily and free to the public.








EXHIBITIONS

Daniel Brush: Cuffs and Necks features two series by the American artist Daniel Brush, which have never before been exhibited in the U.S. Fascinated with the history of jewelry, Brush is a self-taught master metalworker whose work explores the relationship of structure and meaning and redefines jewelry's role in our lives today. The exhibition features: *Necks*, a series of 117 chokers also captured as photographs in the artist's first visual poetry book; and *Cuffs*, a set of 72 bangles inspired by the Nizam of Hyderabad's jewels and by the bracelet's cultural role in India. Alongside these two series, the exhibition also offers an insight into Daniel Brush's rich creative universe by including paintings and other art objects produced by the artist in the recent years.










EXHIBITIONS








EXHIBITIONS

The Fabulous Destiny of Tavernier's Diamonds: From the Great Mogul to the Sun King presents replicas of 20 diamonds previously owned by Louis XIV, and now mostly lost to the world, which were recreated through a partnership with the Muséum National d'Histoire Naturelle in Paris. The traveling merchant Jean-Baptiste Tavernier sold hundreds of diamonds from the Mogul Empire of India to Louis XIV in 1668, of which 20 exceptional examples were immediately singled out to be included in the book The Six Voyages of Jean-Baptiste Tavernier, 1676. All but the Blue Diamond (now the Hope Diamond) disappeared in the 19th century.







DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

INTRODUCTION

In 2 hours and 30 minutes, the introductory course is the beginner's guide to learning about and understanding jewelry.

The Engagement Ring: History, Gemology & Know How

2.5 hrs, \$125, max. 8 seats *NEW

The engagement ring, a symbol of union and romance around the world, deserves a closer look. With this workshop, you will learn about the history of the ring from an art historian, while a gemologist introduces you to the quality and characteristics of gems. Finally, a jeweler will reveal some of the workshop's best kept secrets used to create the most beautiful ring of all.

SAVOIR-FAIRE

Step by step, become familiar with the jewelry arts and crafts, their techniques and their savoir-faire.

Trying out the Jeweler's Techniques

2 hrs, \$125, max. 8 seats *1/2

Discover how a high jewelry masterpiece is created. You will try out the jewelers' gestures hands-on, and experience for yourself all the richness of these artistic professions, guided personally by the Master Jewelers.

From Design to Mock-up

4 hrs, \$250, max. 12 seats

Exploring the first steps in the creation of a jewel. This class is conducted by an experienced jewelry mock-up maker, a drawing teacher and an instructor. From the first stroke of the pencil to creating your own pewter mock-up, discover for yourself the virtuosity of jewelry-making.

Introduction to Setting

Two Master Setters will introduce you to the different gemstone setting techniques, which you will execute yourself, while seated at the jeweler's workbench.

Trying Your Hand at Japanese Urushi Lacquer

Create your own lacquer work butterfly by using three of the lacquer masters' ancestral techniques: color application, Maki-e and mosaics in mother-of-pearl.

The Gouaché in High Jewelry 1: The Light

3 hrs. \$250. max. 6 seats *NEW

Creating a piece of High Jewelry starts with a "gouaché": a painted sketch that will act as a guide for all the craftsmen involved—mock-up makers, jewelers, gemologists, and stone setters. Using three different paint colors, you will learn how to represent volume in a white gold jewel through the positioning of light and shadow using gouache.

The Gouaché in High Jewelry 2: The Color

In the second class devoted to this technique, you will discover how color—combined with the depiction of light—enables the designer to reproduce both the color and shape of stones, until they appear to come to life.

ART HISTORY OF JEWELRY

Immerse yourself in the very essence of the history of jewelry. Courses are taught by two art historians.

Gold & Jewelry, from Antiquity to the Renaissance Princes

Pharaohs, emperors of Rome and Byzantium, princes of the Middle Ages and the Renaissance; the great and powerful have all used gold as a symbol of their power. From the techniques of casting and repoussé to chasing and granulation, the talent of goldsmiths is a testament to the epic story of gold.

The Birth of Jewelry

From Louis XIV to contemporary artists, punctuated by extraordinary discoveries, the history of jewelry is marked by great creators. After a retrospective journey and a presentation of the most famous jewelers, from Baroque to Art Déco, from gems and precious metals to the most innovative materials, experience for yourself the blossoming of modern jewelry.

Amulets & Precious Symbols

Discover the symbolic meaning of precious, fine, and ornamental gemstones and how people find inspiration and strength in them. You will learn that every culture has its own emblematic images, and even stones. These legends and beliefs have fascinated people through time and all around the planet: from the Mughal emperors to Napoleon, from Catherine de Medici to Elizabeth Taylor, among countless others.

Entering the Van Cleef & Arpels Universe

Explore Van Cleef & Arpels' different sources of inspiration from the beginning: nature, art, astronomy, and imaginary worlds are some of the themes at the heart of the Maison's creations. You will then have the privilege of viewing some of Van Cleef & Arpels' unique and most treasured pieces.

THE UNIVERSE OF GEMSTONES

Descend into the heart of the earth to discover the origin and the evolution of its treasures: the gemstones. You will learn how to distinguish precious stones and how to handle them, following advice from gemology experts, becoming therefore, a shrewd amateur.

Introduction to Gemology

Guided by two professors, with gemstones in your hands, you will take your first steps into the world of minerals. Through this course, you will better understand their beauty and their characteristics.

Recognize the Gemstones

Become a knowledgeable connoisseur of gemstones by training your eye and discovering the tools of the gemologist. Imagine that you are at one of the world's legendary gemstone markets: Chanthaburi, Thailand; Ratnapura, Sri Lanka; or Bogota, Colombia. Your goal: seek out and select your gemstones with confidence! This class is conducted by a gemologist and an instructor.

The Diamond's Magic: Symbols & Legends

You will hear the stories of the most famous diamonds that made their mark on history, contemplate their replicas, and discover antique documents and stunning pictures of legendary gemstones.


