A Word From Our President

Dear Students, Dear Friends,

We are pleased to present our new program which spotlights the subject of jewelry design.

Seldom studied and published, even more rarely exhibited, jewelry design remains practically unknown to the general public. Nevertheless, jewelry design plays an essential role, serving as the reference point for all those involved in the creation of a jewel.

After having devoted a research project to this subject, L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts is pleased to announce, not only the creation of a new course on this topic, but also the organization of an exhibition in Paris, "Designing Jewels", from October 14th 2021 to February 14th 2022, as well as the publication of a book co-published with Norma.

Simultaneously, in Hong Kong, the second permanent campus of L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts is hosting the exhibition "Lacloche Jewelers" from November 22nd to April 6th. This exhibition, which was first presented in Paris in Fall 2019, sheds light on the Maison Lacloche, which was one of Paris' celebrated Maisons from the Belle Époque period to the 1960s. Through jewelry. clocks and vanity cases—the Lacloche specialty—as well as archival documents, the retrospective illustrates various trends, including the naturalism of Art Nouveau, and the penchant for the Far East during the Roaring Twenties, the modernism of Art Deco, and the charmingly seductive creations of the 1950s.

In addition, we will continue our program of free **online** Conversations open to all. From September to December, 6 themes will be broadcast live from our exhibitions in Paris and Hong Kong, from the GemGenève fair or from the Florae exhibition organized by Van Cleef & Arpels. From the secret language of flowers to Art Deco, from the mysteries of jewelry design to the art of precious boxes, our talks will embark you on a journey in the fascinating world of jewelry, from the comfort of your home.

Enjoy your discovery and see you soon at L'ÉCOLE, in Paris, in Hong Kong or online!

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Course From Design to Mock-up

ONCE UPON A TIME THERE WAS JEWELRY DESIGN

AT THE ORIGIN OF THE JEWEL: DESIGN, HISTORY, EVOLUTION AND TECHNIQUE

The first step in of the long process of creating a piece of jewelry, the jewelry design is an ancient practice that dates back to the Renaissance. Rendered in pencil, pen, or brush on various surfaces, such as paper, card, parchment, or tracing paper, it gives rise to the final jewelry piece. This course is the fruit of an important research project carried out over the period of one year by L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts. The research was done in archives, libraries, museums, and inside the patrimonial collections of several great jewelry Maisons.

The unique and original content is revealed to you by a jewelry art historian and a designer.

During this course, you will observe how "a simple drawing" gives life to a jewelry creation. Who are the authors of jewelry drawings, the "designers"? What execution techniques do they rely upon? What are the uses of jewelry drawings over time? In three sections, you will grasp the importance of beauty in jewelry design, from the $15^{\rm th}$ century to today. The jewelry art history teacher will unveil works that are as beautiful as they are remarkable.

The designer will give a contemporary point of view, relying upon her experience as a designer and gouacheuse in several Maisons on the Place Vendôme. She will show her tools and one of her sketchbooks.

You will then have the opportunity to handle the different types of materials used over the centuries and to leaf through several illustrated catalogues of gouachés, recently published by the Maisons in order to present their High Jewelry collections.

FROM DESIGN TO MOCK-UP

EXPLORE THE FIRST STEPS IN CREATING A JEWEL

1

Once the design is finished, the process of creating a jewel begins with a "gouaché" painted design, depicting its color, shape, and volume in actual size.

2

You will understand the three stages which allow a jewel to be represented in two dimensions: the drawing, the tracing, and the gouaché.

3

You will also be able to paint the facets of a diamond.

4

Sitting at the workbench in our Jewelry Workshop, you will then experience the mock-up maker's gestures while creating a pewter mock-up.

5

The work of the mock-up maker consists of interpreting the gouaché to offer a three-dimensional interpretation of the final jewel. Mock-ups are made of pewter, a metal that is more malleable and therefore easier to work than gold.

6

From a pewter plate, you will be invited to make your own mock-up of a butterfly jewel.

7

You will cut a butterfly out of metal, shape it and decorate it with rhinestones.

8

You will then decorate it with rhinestones, which prefigure the location of the diamonds for the final piece.

9

At the end, you will leave with the gouaché and the pewter mock-up made during the course!

THE GOUACHÉ IN HIGH JEWELRY 1 – THE LIGHT

DEPICTING LIGHT ON A GOUACHÉ PAINTING, THE FIRST STAGE IN CREATING A HIGH JEWELRY PIECE

A "gouaché" is the first step in the creation of a High Jewelry piece: a painted design that will act as a guide for all the craftsmen involved — mock-up makers, jewelers, gemologists and stone setters.

A highly skilled technique, it consists of depicting three-dimensional volumes: although the painted design is flat, the jewel is a threedimensional object. At L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts, two classes are devoted to this technique of High Jewelry design: "The Gouaché in High Jewelry 1: The Light" and "The Gouaché in High Jewelry 2: The Color".

After a presentation of the gouaché technique, you will experience the designer's gestures while painting a white gold piece in the shape of a bow.

Using three different colors, you will learn how to position light and shadow, and then depict them using gouaché.

You will understand the creative process and become familiar with this specific High Jewelry design technique.

DESIGNING



Sometimes reduced to a few pencil lines thrown on a sheet of paper, but often taking on the appearance of a veritable work of art, rich in color and nuance, drawings or designs of jewelry are unique in that they touch us by their beauty, as much as they teach us about the process of creating a piece of jewelry.

Little studied and published, even more rarely exhibited, jewelry designs remain relatively unknown to the general public. Nevertheless, the jewelry design plays an essential role, serving as the reference point for all those involved in the creation of a jewel. Since the Renaissance, the drawing constitutes the first, and indeed, one might say the primordial step, in that it gives life to the idea, and allows the idea to be realized.

It is to this long neglected object—a technical tool serving the artisans involved in the fabrication of the iewelry but also a sensitive work—which L'ÉCOLE. School of Jewelry Arts wishes to pay tribute, by shining light on its history, technique, authors and status. Following the launch in 2018 of a research

project into jewelry design and the development of a course on this unique subject, L'ÉCOLE is proud to organize the first exhibition devoted to this theme, explored from a wide variety of perspectives. The selected works broadly cover the 19th century, beginning in the 1760s and ending with the First World War, and were executed by numerous artists and designers, either famous or anonymous, illustrating a great diversity of techniques and uses. All come from the Van Cleef & Arpels Jewelry Culture Fund, set up for research, presentation and educational purposes.





LACLOCHE EXHIBITION TRAVELS TO HONG KONG!

The Maison Lacloche was one of Paris' celebrated jewelry houses from the Belle Époque period to the 1960s.

Established on the rue de la Paix in 1901, it also had boutiques in Madrid and London, as well as branches in Nice, Biarritz, San Sebastián, Cannes and Deauville. Lacloche Frères, and later Jacques Lacloche, created jewelry for royalty: Queen Victoria of Spain, Edward VII of England, the kings of Greece and Siam, as well as for aristocratic figures such as the Duchess of Westminster, and even Hollywood stars like Grace Kelly.

After a first presentation at L'ÉCOLE in Paris in Fall 2019, the exhibition "Lacloche Jewelers" now travels to L'ÉCOLE Asia Pacific in Hong Kong.

Through jewelry, clocks and vanity cases—the Lacloche specialty—as well as archival documents, the retrospective will illustrate various trends, including the naturalism of Art Nouveau and the penchant for the Far East during the Roaring Twenties, the modernism of Art Deco, and the charmingly seductive creations of the 1950s.

Discover 5 Key Pieces of the Exhibition:

Ladies pendant-watch in sculpted rock crystal, gold, platinum, pearls, diamonds, miniature painted on alabaster, signed Paillet, dial covered with facetted amethysts, movement by Vacheron Constantin. Made by the Verger workshop for Lacloche Frères. 1908. Vacheron Constantin Heritage.

In addition to the refined beauty of the setting, one can appreciate the charming neoclassical style typical of the Belle Époque which miniaturist Fernand Paillet named "Nymphe lutinée par les amours" (Nymph teased by Cupids).

During the Roaring Twenties, the world of fashion and accessories displayed a penchant for the Far East. While Lacloche's designers were influenced by China, they were more likely to find the inspiration for their decorative motifs in Japanese works of art, whose poetry they especially appreciated. Boxes, cigarette cases and vanity cases were the jeweler's specialty.

This bracelet was displayed on the stand of Lacloche Frères at the International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts in Paris in 1925. The family who purchased this item of jewelry on this occasion kept it in their possession until a recent auction. We can admire the mastery of the jeweler: buff-top cabochon rubies (with the pavilion facetted to provide the stone with greater brilliance and to reflect the light), the open, articulated mount, and the millegrain diamond setting.



Each link of this bracelet, mounted on a spring, is articulated. The bracelet is a fine example of the jeweler's technical mastery. This inventive and elegant model was highly successful before the war. Jacques Lacloche also made a version of it set with carved emeralds and sapphires.

The stones, mounted on two removable clips, are interchangeable. Depending on the wearer's mood or their outfit, this bracelet cuff could be adorned with jade, topaz or turquoise cabochons. Made by Lucien Girard. This is an example of the bold modernity for which Jacques Lacloche had a particular fondness.

A word about your professional career?

How did you enter the jewelry world? Before becoming a jewelry designer, I started with the arts. I studied illustration, engraving and commercial art at the École Supérieure Estienne.

It was during my last internship that I wished to discover a new artistic discipline. That's why I looked for and entered into an internship in jewelry design at the jeweler Mathon. It was love at first sight! This job brought together everything I liked to do: creating, drawing, imagining in three dimensions and finally designing a feminine and precious object. I fell in love with it hence at the end of the internship I was hired and trained in this wonderful profession.

When and how did you become a teacher

at L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts? I heard about the reputation of L'École when I was a designer of high jewelry at Boucheron. I often traveled to create special orders for foreign clients. I already shared the values of L'ÉCOLE: the meeting of cultures, openness to the world, expertise in jewelry design and gems.

A side note: the windows of the drawing studio overlooked Place Vendôme and the Hôtel de Ségur where L'ÉCOLE is located. I was in awe of the richness of the program offered and was very attracted by the opportunity to pass on my knowledge.

So very naturally I introduced myself to L'ÉCOLE in 2019 when I became a freelance designer to collaborate together.

Which courses do you teach?

Do you have a favorite course? I teach the course "Having Access to Van Cleef & Arpels Creations" which details how Van Cleef & Arpels creative teams design a collection and what their inspirations are.

Since 2019, I have also had the pleasure of participating in the creation of a new course "Once Upon a Time There Was Jewelry Design" in partnership with Inezita Gay-Eckel, jewelry historian, and Guillaume Glorieux, Director of Teaching and Research at L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts. It is a very rich and ambitious course; it draws on unpublished research on jewelry design from the 15th century to the present day. In this class, with Inezita, we play the role of detectives to explore this art full of mysteries and anonymous artists, while revealing its origins, techniques.

It is also an opportunity to admire previously unpublished designs from the Van Cleef & Arpels Jewelry Culture Fund. I hope that everyone who comes to this class will leave with a new perspective on this major art form.



you dream of working on? I often work on several projects simultaneously; jewelry design is the core of my activity as a freelance designer for jewelry Maisons and professionals.

I am also continuing to research unpublished jewelry designs in preparation for a Conversation to be given at L'ÉCOLE this fall that will discuss the creative process and reveal more mysteries.

I'm excited to collaborate as a team on new projects and bring my expertise and creative vision to the table.

My current wish would be to create new pieces, to travel and to experience other cultures in order to promote the influence of the jewelry arts in the world.



And to finish, could you tell us about your favorite jewelry design? I would like to tell you about the one who surely inspired me to do this job: René Lalique.

I first discovered Lalique's designs during an exhibition at the Paris Museum of Decorative Arts in 1992. I was dazzled by the composition, the lively pencil line, the colors of the opals, the translucent enamels and the precious materials. At that time, I was a student of color illustration and I had before my eyes a drawing, a work of art, a remarkable illustration, a jewelry design! Here is the design of a Lalique corsage ornament representing a majestic peacock that perfectly illustrates the mastery of jewelry design: a clever mix of beauty and innovation with soft lines, with an asymmetrical composition typical of Art Nouveau.

But what I particularly like about his designs is that they seem to come alive, his line is quick and precise. Lalique put his energy and genius into each of his creations.

How did you discover L'ÉCOLE, School of Jewelry Arts? I knew about L'ÉCOLE from the beginning, just after its creation in 2012 in a rather roundabout way. While I was living in Paris, a Chinese friend living in China first told me about L'ÉCOLE created by Van Cleef & Arpels. At the time he wanted to follow courses at L'ÉCOLE and needed information. That's how my contact with L'ÉCOLE started.

Which courses did you take, and which one did you prefer? I have taken almost all the courses at L'ÉCOLE, whether it be history of jewelry, gemology, or savoir-faire.

My favorite courses are the history of jewelry courses, regardless of the period, the course "Having Access to Van Cleef & Arpels Creations" and the course "Jewelry and Grand Feu Enameling".

What have the different courses you have taken brought you?


The history of jewelry courses allowed me to discover the different styles according to historical periods, while the savoir-faire courses helped me to discover the process of creation and realization of a piece of high jewelry. And of course, I also had some great encounters during the classes with the teachers and participants!

Has your experience at L'ÉCOLE changed your taste or your way of looking at jewelry? Yes, of course! Thanks to the different courses I have taken at L'ÉCOLE, I now know how to look at a piece of jewelry, through the stones it is composed of, the metal structure, the stone setting, the creation... What interests me the most is to be able to observe antique jewelry, which is what L'ÉCOLE provides through its courses and exhibitions!
